Early ACCESS provides early intervention services to eligible children ages 0-36 months at no cost to families.

By 4 months

Your baby may:

- Smile spontaneously at people
- Mimic facial expressions
- · Babble or copy sounds
- Show emotion
- · Watch moving objects
- · Hold their head steady
- Reach for objects

By 6 months

Your baby may:

- Prefer familiar faces over strangers
- · Respond to their name
- Make sounds to show feelings
- Show curiosity
- · Bring items to their mouth
- Roll over
- · Sit without support

By 12 months

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Your baby may:

- · Cry when caregivers leave
- Be shy around strangers
 - · Try to say words
 - Use simple gestures for "no" or "bye-bye"
 - · Drink from a cup
- Follow simple directions
- Get to a sitting position without help
- Pull up to standing position

By 18 months

Your baby may:

- Use their index finger to point to things
- · Hand items to others
- Say several single words
- · Shake head and say "no"
- Follow 1-step directions
- Engage in pretend play
- Walk without help
- · Eat with a spoon

By 24 months

Your baby may:

- Get excited with other children
- Show independence
- Use sentences with 2-4 words
- Point to items/pictures when named
- Play simple make-believe games
- Look for hidden objects
- Run and climb
- · Play with a ball
