Leaf Wreath

Supplies needed:

- Paper Plates
- Scissors
- Glue
- Leaves
- Glitter
- Pom Poms
- Bows
- Markers/Paint Pens

Instructions:

Step 1: Collect leaves from your yard or a park nearby.

Step 2: Cut out the middle of the plate, leaving about 2-3 inches for a boarder to place leaves on.

Step 3: Place a little glue on a leaf, place the leaf on the plate.

Step 4: Add glitter, bows, stickers, or other items you wish to add for a personalized touch on the leaves. **Step 5:** Allow the wreath time to dry before hanging up.

Optional Craft Step: Have a kid who is extra creative? Paint or draw on the leaves for added fun. Do this before step 3 to make things easier.





Pumpkin Bread:

Enjoy the taste of fall with freshly made pumpkin bread!

Ingredients:

- 1½ cups sugar
- ½ cup vegetable oil
- 2 large eggs
- 1 cup canned pumpkin puree

(not the entire can of pumpkin)

- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- ¾ teaspoon salt
- 1 ¾ cups all-purpose flour
- ¾ teaspoon cinnamon
- ½ teaspoon nutmeg
- 1/4 teaspoon cloves
- ¼ teaspoon allspice
- 1/4 teaspoon ginger

Steps

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350° F. Grease and flour an 8.5×4.5 -inch loaf pan (or spray with nonstick baking spray). Set aside.
- 2. In a large bowl, whisk together the sugar, oil, and eggs. Add the pumpkin and vanilla; whisk to combine. Sprinkle the baking soda and salt over top; whisk until well blended.
- 3. Add the flour, cinnamon, nutmeg, allspice, cloves, and ginger; stir gently just until combined and no steaks of flour remain. Be careful not to over-mix.
- 4. Transfer the batter to the prepared pan. Bake for 60-70 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted in the center of the loaf comes out clean. Dark or nonstick pans may be done in as little as 45-55 minutes.
- 5. Let the bread cool in the pan for about 10 minutes, then transfer to a wire rack to cool completely.

Learn and Play Activities for Different Ages

Every child is different and will develop skills at their own pace. Play time is a great way to help your littles one's development. Visit our website at iafamilysupportnetwork.org to view our child development page for more information on specific ages and stages of development.

- Infants (0-12): Take your child on a stroll to the park and show them the great outdoors. Hand them a leaf... Describe what they are feeling-ex: the leaf feels crunchy, the wind is cold, etc.
- Toddlers (1-2 years): Need a hand? Have your child *help* you with raking the leaves for a little bit. Guide them on the movement of picking up and putting the leaves into the bag. Narrate and make it a fun learning opportunity!
- Toddlers (2-3years): Chalk on the sidewalk is a great opportunity to practice fine motor skills and teach them things. Show your child how to draw a pumpkin and talk about the shapes and colors you are using to make this picture then have them do it too.
- Preschoolers (3-5 years): Color Walk. Take your child on a walk around the
 neighborhood to find different colors. Talk about the leaves changing colors and
 all the shapes you find. Want to go even further from the home? Take them to a
 local pumpkin patch and do a scavenger hunt for the biggest and smallest
 pumpkin.
